THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

THE READINGS

First Reading – Acts 2:14a, 36-42

Reader: A Reading from Acts

¹⁴ But Peter, taking his stand with the *other* eleven, raised his voice and declared to them:

36 Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ—this Jesus whom you crucified.”

37 Now when they heard *this*, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles,

“Brothers, what are we to do?” 38 Peter *said* to them,

“Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 For the promise is for you and

your children and for all who are far away, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself.” 40 And with many other

words he solemnly testified and kept on urging them, saying,

“Be saved from this perverse generation!” 41 So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there

were added about three thousand souls. ⁴² They

were continually devoting themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread

and to prayer.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

Second Reading – 1st Peter 1:17-23

Reader: A reading from 1st Peter

¹⁷ If you address as Father the One who impartially judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves in fear during the time of your stay *on earth*; ¹⁸ knowing that you were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, ¹⁹ but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, *the blood* of Christ. ²⁰ For He was foreknown before the foundation of the world, but has appeared in these last times for the sake of you ²¹ who through Him are believers in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. ²² Since you have purified your souls in obedience to

the truth for a sincere love of the brothers *and* sisters, fervently love one another from the heart, ²³ for you have been born again not of seed which is perishable, but imperishable, *that is*, through the living and enduring word of God.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel – Luke 24: 13-35

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia

Reader: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹³ And behold, on that very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, which was sixty stadia from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ And they were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place. ¹⁵ While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and *began* traveling with them. ¹⁶ But their eyes were kept from recognizing Him. ¹⁷ And He said to them, “What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?” And they came to a stop, looking sad. ¹⁸ One *of them*, named Cleopas, answered and said to Him, “Are You *possibly* the only one living near Jerusalem who does not know about the things that happened here in these days?” ¹⁹ And He said to them, “What sort of things?” And they said to Him, “Those about Jesus the Nazarene, who proved to be a prophet mighty in deed and word in the sight of God and all the people, ²⁰ and how the chief priests and our rulers handed Him over to be sentenced to death, and crucified Him. ²¹ But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, it is *now* the third day since these things happened. ²² But also some women among us left us bewildered. When they were at the tomb early in the

morning, ²³ and did not find His body, they came, saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said that He was alive. ²⁴ And so some of those who were with us went to the tomb, and found it just exactly as the women also had said; but Him they did not see.” ²⁵ And *then* He said to them, “You foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to come into His glory?” ²⁷ Then beginning with Moses and with all the Prophets, He explained to them the things *written* about Himself in all the Scriptures.

²⁸ And they approached the village where they were going, and He gave the impression that He was going farther. ²⁹ And so they strongly urged Him, saying, “Stay with us, for it is *getting* toward evening, and the day is now nearly over.” So He went in to stay with them. ³⁰ And it came about, when He had reclined *at the table* with them, that He took the bread and blessed *it*, and He broke *it* and *began* giving *it* to them. ³¹ And *then* their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight. ³² They said to one another, “Were our hearts not burning within us when He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?” ³³ And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven gathered together and those who were with them, ³⁴ saying, “The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon!” ³⁵ They *began* to relate their experiences on the road, and how He was recognized by them at the breaking of the bread.
