**First Reading – Acts 10:34-43**

**Reader:** A reading from Acts

<sup>34</sup> Opening his mouth, Peter said:

“I most certainly understand *now* that God is not one to show partiality, <sup>35</sup> but in every nation the man who fears Him and does what is right is welcome to Him. <sup>36</sup> The word which He sent to the sons of Israel, preaching peace through Jesus Christ (He is Lord of all)— <sup>37</sup> you yourselves know the thing which took place throughout all Judea, starting from Galilee, after the baptism which John proclaimed. <sup>38</sup> *You know of*

Jesus of Nazareth, how God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and *how* He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. <sup>39</sup> We are witnesses of all the things He did both in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They also put Him to death by hanging Him on a cross. <sup>40</sup> God raised Him up on the third day and granted that He become visible, <sup>41</sup> not to all the people, but to witnesses who were chosen beforehand by God, *that is*, to us who ate and drank with Him after He arose from the dead. <sup>42</sup> And He ordered us to preach to the people, and solemnly to testify that this is the One who has been appointed by God as Judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup> Of Him all the prophets bear witness that through His name everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins.”

things that are on earth. <sup>3</sup> For you have died and your life is

hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> When Christ, who is our life, is

revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory.

<sup>5</sup> Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as

dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed,

which amounts to idolatry... since you laid aside the old self

**20** Now on the first *day* of the week Mary Magdalene \*came early to the tomb, while it \*was still dark, and \*saw the stone *already* taken away from the tomb. **2** So she \*ran and \*came to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and \*said to them, “They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him.” **3** So Peter and the other disciple went forth, and they were going to the tomb. **4** The two were running together; and the other disciple ran ahead faster than Peter and came to the tomb first; **5** and stooping and looking in, he \*saw the linen wrappings lying *there*; but he did not go in. **6** And so Simon Peter also \*came, following him, and entered the tomb; and he \*saw the linen wrappings lying *there*, **7** and the face-cloth which had been on His head, not lying with the linen wrappings, but rolled up in a place by itself. **8** So the other disciple who had first come to the tomb then also entered, and he saw and believed. **9** For as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that He must rise again from the dead. **10** So the disciples went away again to their own homes.

**11** But Mary was standing outside the tomb weeping; and so, as she wept, she stooped and looked into the tomb; **12** and she \*saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head and one at the feet, where the body of Jesus had been lying. **13** And they \*said to her, “Woman, why are you weeping?” She \*said to them, “Because they have taken away my Lord, and

I do not know where they have laid Him.” <sup>14</sup> When she had said this, she turned around and \*saw Jesus standing *there*, and did not know that it was Jesus.

<sup>15</sup> Jesus \*said to her, “Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?” Supposing Him to be the gardener, she \*said to Him, “Sir, if you have carried Him away, tell me where you have laid Him, and I will take Him away.” <sup>16</sup> Jesus \*said to her, “Mary!” She turned and \*said to Him in Hebrew, “Rabboni!” (which means, Teacher). <sup>17</sup> Jesus \*said to her, “Stop clinging to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, ‘I ascend to My Father and your Father, and My God and your God.’” <sup>18</sup> Mary Magdalene \*came, announcing to the disciples, “I have seen the Lord,” and *that* He had said these things to her.

all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father,  
now and forever.
