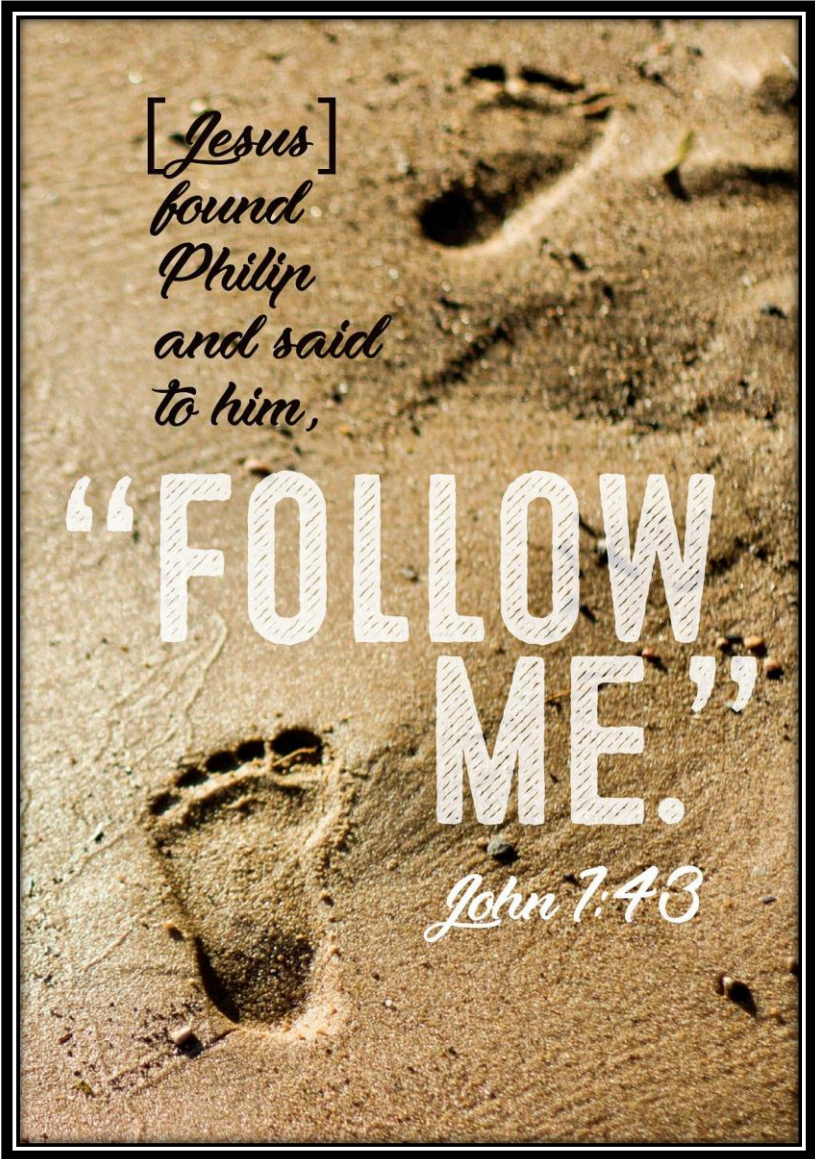

First Reading – Isaiah 62:1-5

Reader: The Lesson is written in the 62nd Chapter of Isaiah beginning at the 1st verse.

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent,
And for Jerusalem's sake I will not keep quiet,
Until her righteousness goes forth like brightness,
And her salvation like a torch that is burning.

2 The nations will see your righteousness,
And all kings your glory;

And you will be called by a new name
Which the mouth of the Lord will designate.

³ You will also be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord,
And a royal headband in the hand of your God.

⁴ It will no longer be said to you, "Forsaken,"
Nor to your land will it any longer be said, "Desolate";
But you will be called, "My delight is in her,"
And your land, "Married";
For the Lord delights in you,
And *to Him* your land will be married.

⁵ For as a young man marries a virgin,
So your sons will marry you;
And as the groom rejoices over the bride,
So your God will rejoice over you.

Psalm 36: 5-10

5 Your love, O LORD, reaches to the heavens,
and your faithfulness to the clouds.

6 Your righteousness is like the strong mountains, your
justice like the great deep;
you save both man and beast, O LORD.

7 How priceless is your love, O God!
**your people take refuge under the shadow of your
wings.**

8 They feast upon the abundance of your house;
you give them drink from the river of your delights.

9 For with you is the well of life,
and in your light we see light.

10 Continue your loving-kindness to those who know you,
and your favor to those who are true of heart.

Second Reading – 1 Corinthians 12: 1-11

Reader: The Epistle is written in the 12th Chapter of 1 Corinthians beginning at the 1st verse.

Now concerning spiritual *gifts*, brothers *and sisters*, I do not want you to be unaware. ² You know that when you were pagans, *you were* led astray to the mute idols, however you were led. ³ Therefore I make known to you that no one speaking by the Spirit of God says, “Jesus is accursed”; and no one can say, “Jesus is Lord,” except by the Holy Spirit.

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit. ⁵ And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. ⁶ There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all *persons*. ⁷ But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ For to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, and to another the word of knowledge according to the same Spirit; ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another *various* kinds of tongues, and to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills.

The Gospel – John 2:1-11

Reader: The Holy Gospel is written in the 2nd Chapter of the Gospel according to Saint John beginning at the 1st verse.

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there; ² and both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding. ³ When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus *said to Him, "They have no wine." ⁴ And Jesus *said to her, "What *business* do you have with Me, woman? My hour has not yet come." ⁵ His mother *said to the servants, "Whatever He tells you, do it." ⁶ Now there were six stone waterpots standing there for the Jewish custom of purification, containing two or three measures each. ⁷ Jesus *said to them, "Fill the waterpots with water." So they filled them up to the brim. ⁸ And He *said to them, "Draw *some* out now and take *it* to the headwaiter." And they took *it to him*. ⁹ Now when the headwaiter tasted the water which had become wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter *called the

groom, ¹⁰ and *said to him, “Every man serves the good wine first, and when *the guests* are drunk, *then he serves* the poorer *wine*; *but* you have kept the good wine until now.” ¹¹ This beginning of *His* signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and revealed His glory; and His disciples believed in Him.
