

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

THE READINGS

First Reading – Isaiah 66:14, 12-14

Reader: A reading from Isaiah

66 Thus says the LORD,

“Heaven is My throne and the earth is My footstool.
Where then is a house you could build for Me?

And where is a place that I may rest?

²“For My hand made all these things,

Thus all these things came into being,” declares the LORD.

“But to this one I will look,

To him who is humble and contrite of spirit, and who
trembles at My word.

³“*But* he who kills an ox is *like* one who slays a man;

He who sacrifices a lamb is *like* the one who breaks a dog’s
neck;

He who offers a grain offering *is like one who offers* swine’s
blood;

He who burns incense is *like* the one who blesses an idol.

As they have chosen their *own* ways,

And their soul delights in their abominations,

⁴ So I will choose their punishments

And will bring on them what they dread.

Because I called, but no one answered;

I spoke, but they did not listen.

And they did evil in My sight

And chose that in which I did not delight.”...

¹² For thus says the LORD, “Behold, I extend peace to her like a river,

And the glory of the nations like an overflowing stream;

And you will be nursed, you will be carried on the hip and fondled on the knees.

¹³ “As one whom his mother comforts, so I will comfort you; And you will be comforted in Jerusalem.”

¹⁴ Then you will see *this*, and your heart will be glad,

And your bones will flourish like the new grass;

And the hand of the LORD will be made known to His servants,

But He will be indignant toward His enemies.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 66:1-8

¹ Be joyful in God, all you lands;

sing the glory of his name;

sing the glory of his praise.

² Say to God, “How awesome are your deeds!

because of your great strength your enemies cringe before you.

³ All the earth bows down before you,

sings to you, sings out your name”

⁴ Come now and see the works of God,

how wonderful he is in his doing toward all people.

⁵ He turned the sea into dry land,

so that they went through the water on foot,

and there we rejoiced in him.

⁶ In his might he rules for ever;

his eyes keep watch over the nations;

let no rebel rise up against him.

⁷ Bless our God, you peoples;

make the voice of his praise to be heard;

⁸ Who holds our souls in life,

and will not allow our feet to slip.

Second Reading – Galatians 6:1-16

Reader: A reading from Galatians

6 Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; *each one* looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted. ² Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ. ³ For if anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. ⁴ But each one must examine his own work, and then he will have *reason for* boasting in regard to himself alone, and not in regard to another. ⁵ For each one will bear his own load.

⁶ The one who is taught the word is to share all good things with the one who teaches *him*.

⁷ Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap. ⁸ For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. ⁹ Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary. ¹⁰ So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

¹¹ See with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. ¹² Those who desire to make a good showing in the flesh try to compel you to be circumcised, simply so that they will not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. ¹³ For those who are circumcised do not even keep the Law themselves, but they desire to have you circumcised so that they may boast in your flesh. ¹⁴ But may it never be that I would boast, except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. ¹⁵ For neither is circumcision anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. ¹⁶ And those who will walk by this rule, peace and mercy *be* upon them, and upon the Israel of God.

The Gospel – Luke 10:1-11, 16-20

Reader: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Luke

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

10 Now after this the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them in pairs ahead of Him to every city and place where He Himself was going to come. **2** And He was saying to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest. **3** Go; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. **4** Carry no money belt, no bag, no shoes; and greet no one on the way. **5** Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace *be* to this house.' **6** If a man of peace is there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. **7** Stay in that house, eating and drinking what they give you; for the laborer is worthy of his wages. Do not keep moving from house to house. **8** Whatever city you enter and they receive you, eat what is set before you; **9** and heal those in it who are sick, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' **10** But whatever city you enter and they do not receive you, go out into its streets and say, **11** 'Even the dust of your city which clings to our feet we wipe off *in protest* against you; yet be sure of this, that the kingdom of God has come near.'

16 "The one who listens to you listens to Me, and the one who rejects you rejects Me; and he who rejects Me rejects the One who sent Me."

17 The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in Your name." **18** And He said to them, "I was watching Satan fall from heaven like lightning. **19** Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing will injure you. **20** Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are recorded in heaven."

Reader: The Gospel of Christ.

where you dwell with all your sons and daughters;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
the firstborn of all creation,
the head of the Church,
and the author of our salvation;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father,
now and forever.
