

### **First Reading – Isaiah 66:1-4, 12-14**

**Reader:** The Lesson is written in the 66thth Chapter of Isaiah beginning at the 1st verse.

**66** Thus says the LORD,

“Heaven is My throne and the earth is My footstool.

Where then is a house you could build for Me?

And where is a place that I may rest?

<sup>2</sup>“For My hand made all these things,

Thus all these things came into being,” declares the LORD.

“But to this one I will look,

To him who is humble and contrite of spirit, and who trembles at My word.

<sup>3</sup> “*But* he who kills an ox is *like* one who slays a man; He who sacrifices a lamb is *like* the one who breaks a dog’s neck;

He who offers a grain offering *is like one who offers* swine’s blood;

He who burns incense is *like* the one who blesses an idol.

As they have chosen their *own* ways,

And their soul delights in their abominations,

<sup>4</sup> So I will choose their punishments

And will bring on them what they dread.

Because I called, but no one answered;

I spoke, but they did not listen.

And they did evil in My sight

And chose that in which I did not delight.” ...

<sup>12</sup> For thus says the LORD, “Behold, I extend peace to her like a river,

And the glory of the nations like an overflowing stream;

And you will be nursed, you will be carried on the hip and fondled on the knees.

<sup>13</sup> “As one whom his mother comforts, so I will comfort you;

And you will be comforted in Jerusalem.”

<sup>14</sup> Then you will see *this*, and your heart will be glad,

And your bones will flourish like the new grass;

And the hand of the LORD will be made known to His servants,

But He will be indignant toward His enemies.

**Reader:** Here endeth the Lesson.

## **Psalm 66:1-8**

<sup>1</sup> O BE joyful in God, all ye lands;

**sing praises unto the honour of his Name; make his praise to be glorious.**

<sup>2</sup> Say unto God, ‘O how wonderful are thy works!

**because of the greatness of thy power**

**shall thine enemies feign obedience unto thee.**

<sup>3</sup> All the world shall worship thee,  
**sing of thee, and praise thy Name.'**

<sup>4</sup> O COME hither, and behold the works of God:  
**how wonderful he is in his doing toward  
the children of men.**

<sup>5</sup> He turned the sea into dry land,  
**so that they went through the water on foot;  
there did we rejoice in him.**

<sup>6</sup> He ruleth with his power for ever; his eyes  
keep watch upon the nations:  
**let not such as be rebellious exalt themselves.**

<sup>7</sup> O PRAISE our God, ye peoples,  
**and make the voice of his praise to be heard;**

<sup>8</sup> Who holdeth our soul in life,  
**and suffereth not our feet to slip.**

## **Second Reading – Galatians 6:1-6, 7-16**

**Reader:** The Epistle is written in the 6th Chapter of Galatians beginning at the 1st verse.

**6** Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; *each one* looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted. <sup>2</sup> Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ. <sup>3</sup> For if anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. <sup>4</sup> But each one must examine his own work, and then he will have *reason for* boasting in regard to himself alone, and not in regard to another. <sup>5</sup> For each one will bear his own load.

<sup>6</sup> The one who is taught the word is to share all good things with the one who teaches *him*.

<sup>7</sup> Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap. <sup>8</sup> For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. <sup>9</sup> Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary. <sup>10</sup> So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

<sup>11</sup> See with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. <sup>12</sup> Those who desire to make a good showing in the flesh try to compel you to be circumcised, simply so that they will not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. <sup>13</sup> For those who are circumcised do not even keep the Law themselves, but they desire to have you circumcised so that they may boast in your flesh. <sup>14</sup> But may it never be that I would boast, except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. <sup>15</sup> For neither is circumcision anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. <sup>16</sup> And those who will walk by this rule, peace and mercy *be* upon them, and upon the Israel of God.

### **The Gospel – Luke 10:1-11, 16-20**

**Reader:** The Holy Gospel is written in the 10th Chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Luke beginning at the 1st verse.

**People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

**10** Now after this the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them in pairs ahead of Him to every city and place where He Himself was going to come. <sup>2</sup> And He was saying to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest. <sup>3</sup> Go; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. <sup>4</sup> Carry no money belt, no bag, no shoes; and greet no one on the way. <sup>5</sup> Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house.' <sup>6</sup> If a man of peace is there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. <sup>7</sup> Stay in that house, eating and drinking what they give you; for the laborer is worthy of his wages. Do not keep moving from house to house. <sup>8</sup> Whatever city you enter

and they receive you, eat what is set before you; <sup>9</sup> and heal those in it who are sick, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' <sup>10</sup> But whatever city you enter and they do not receive you, go out into its streets and say, <sup>11</sup> 'Even the dust of your city which clings to our feet we wipe off *in protest* against you; yet be sure of this, that the kingdom of God has come near.'

<sup>16</sup> "The one who listens to you listens to Me, and the one who rejects you rejects Me; and he who rejects Me rejects the One who sent Me."

<sup>17</sup> The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in Your name." <sup>18</sup> And He said to them, "I was watching Satan fall from heaven like lightning.

<sup>19</sup> Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing will injure you. <sup>20</sup> Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are recorded in heaven."
