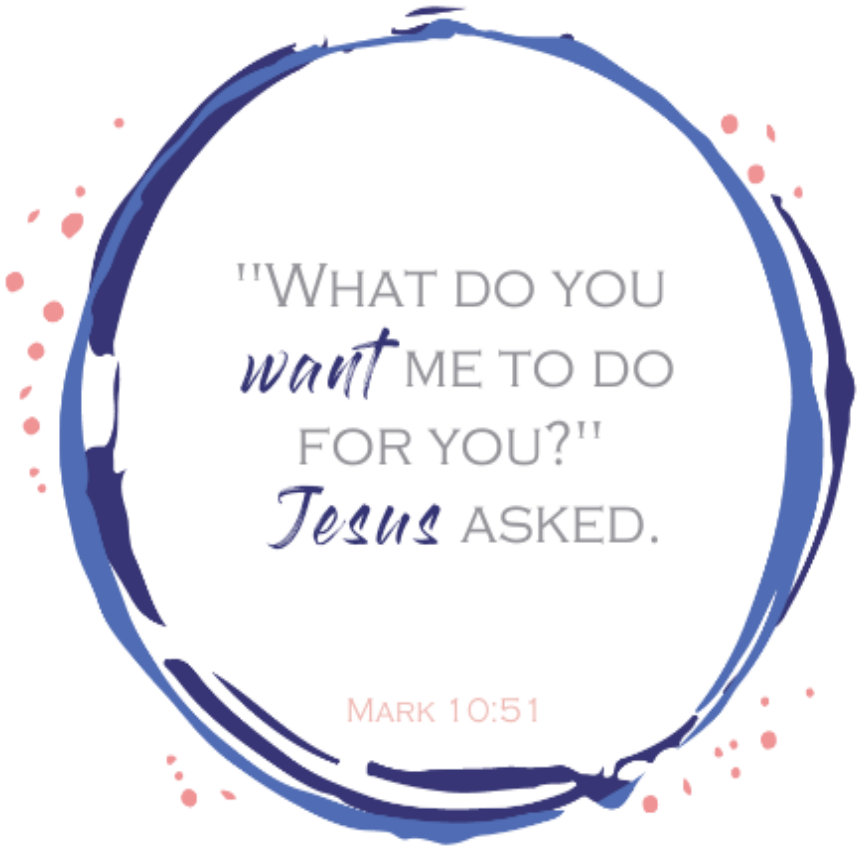

First Reading – Jeremiah 31:7-9

Reader: The Lesson is written in the 531st Chapter of Jeremiah beginning at the 7th verse.

⁷ For this is what the Lord says:
“Sing aloud with joy for Jacob,
And be joyful with the chief of the nations;
Proclaim, give praise, and say,
‘Lord, save Your people,
The remnant of Israel!’

⁸ Behold, I am bringing them from the north country,
And I will gather them from the remote parts of the earth,
Among them those who are blind and those who limp,
The pregnant woman and she who is in labor, together;
They will return here as a great assembly.

⁹ They will come with weeping,
And by pleading I will bring them;
I will lead them by streams of waters,
On a straight path on which they will not stumble;
For I am a father to Israel,
And Ephraim is My firstborn.”

Psalm 126 – When Zion’s Captive Ones Returned

When Zion’s captive ones
Had, by the LORD, returned –

Second Reading – Hebrews 7:23-28

Reader: The Epistle is written in the 7th Chapter of Hebrews beginning at the 23rd verse.

²³ The *former* priests, on the one hand, existed in greater numbers because they were prevented by death from continuing; ²⁴ Jesus, on the other hand, because He continues forever, holds His priesthood permanently. ²⁵ Therefore He is also able to save forever those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them.

²⁶ For it was fitting for us to have such a high priest, holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens; ²⁷ who has no daily need, like those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the *sins* of the people, because He did this once for all *time* when He offered up Himself. ²⁸ For the Law appoints men as high priests who are weak, but the word of the oath, which came after the Law, *appoints* a Son, who has been made perfect forever.

The Gospel – Mark 10:46-52

Reader: The Holy Gospel is written in the 10th Chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Mark beginning at the 46th verse.

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

⁴⁶ Then they *came to Jericho. And *later*, as He was leaving Jericho with His disciples and a large crowd, a beggar who was blind *named* Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the road. ⁴⁷ And when he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" ⁴⁸ Many were sternly telling him to be quiet, but he kept crying out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" ⁴⁹ And Jesus stopped and said, "Call him *here*." So they *called the man who was blind, saying to him, "Take courage, stand up! He is calling for you." ⁵⁰ And throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and came to Jesus. ⁵¹ And replying to him, Jesus said, "What do you want Me to do for you?" And the man who was blind said to Him, "Rabboni, *I want to regain my sight!*" ⁵² And Jesus said

to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." And immediately he regained his sight and *began* following Him on the road.
